MEMBER HIGHLIGHT

Mary Ellen Clinard, Dean

What inspired you to become an organist?

I studied piano in my small town until my teacher retired. In eighth grade I began organ lessons. In college, I had a job as an accompanist in the university's music department. I continued organ lessons in college and since have always had a church job on the side. Now my church job is my main job!

What are a few things that inspire you about your past or current position?

I have always been fortunate to work with loving and generous congregations, serving small, rural, and urban churches. I love hymnody and the challenge of hymn interpretation to bring out the text. My current congregation LOVES the organ!

What bits of advice would you give a beginning organist starting a job in a church?

Learn to be sensitive to the congregation's needs musically. Then, gently broaden their exposure to new music. Don't sacrifice solid theology just to get modern hymns in the service. Offer a broad range of musical styles at each service. If the anthem or hymn is more modern, then I play a traditional/classical prelude, etc. It's a balancing act all the time.
